


Our Communities



Municipal Services

Administration Department

The Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) of the Corporation has the overall responsibility of the strategic direction and operations of the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie. The Administration Department has legislated powers to administer the direction of Council. The Department includes the Clerks Office and the Economic Development and Communications division.

- Operate the Clerk's Office in accordance with the statutory requirements of the Municipal Act, Planning Act and other related statutes
- Provide legislative support to Council and Committees
- Prepare Agendas, Minutes, By-laws, Policies and Agreements and related corporate documents
- Commission documents
- Cemetery administration and burial permit issuance
- Record Council and Committee proceedings and maintain the official records of the Municipality (by-laws, minutes, policies, agreements etc.)
- Respond to requests for access to municipal records received under the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act
- Conduct municipal elections
- Provide municipal lottery licensing program
- Administer the Line Fences Act and Livestock Damage Program
- Administer the Tile Drainage Program
- Oversee Land Use Planning and Real Estate functions
- Responsible for Human Resources



Finance Department

The Finance Department is responsible for the municipal financial records, accounts payable, receivables, payroll, purchasing, water billing, property tax billing, collections, managing customer inquiries and financial information for the Municipality.

Property Taxes

We collect revenue through property taxes to provide municipal services and programs to residents. Taxes provide the main source of revenue for the Municipality, County and School Boards. Tax Bills are generated twice a year with four (4) installment dates; March, June, August & October.

We process many types of payment methods including mail, internet, telephone banking, pre-authorized payments or in-person at the Municipal Office. Online forms for signing up for pre-authorized payments and or the emailing of tax bills are available on our website. arran-elderslie.ca/en/living-here/property-taxes.aspx

Parking

We offer parking throughout the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie at a number of free and paid parking lots. You can view our Parking By-Law to learn more information on parking restrictions. You may purchase a parking pass on our website or by calling the Municipal Office.

Dog Tags

All dogs must be registered in the Municipality of Arran-Elderslie. You can view our Animal Control By-Law for more information on regulations, fines. Each registration is \$15.00 prior to March 31. You must license your dog each year and obtain a permit for a kennel. A dog tag must be attached to the dog's collar at all times. If you get a new dog please come into the Municipal Office or visit our online form on our website to register your dog and to purchase a tag. It is your responsibility to notify the office if there is any change to your pet's information, you are moving out of the Municipality, or you no longer have a dog.





Fire Hydrants

In the winter, please help by removing any snow banks around hydrants, and always avoid parking of vehicles around the hydrants, as valuable time can be lost if fire fighters must clear snow or work around cars upon their arrival at an emergency.

ARE YOU PREPARED?

Emergencies are always unexpected and often catch us unprepared. Health Canada recommends having a 72 hour Emergency Preparedness kit available in the event of a power failure, snow and ice storm, flooding etc.

HAVE ON HAND:

- At least three day's supply of food and water (4 litres per person/day)
- Canned food, crackers and biscuits, honey, peanut butter, jam, instant coffee, tea etc.
- Cutlery, disposable plates, can opener, waterproof matches, and garbage bags.

Prepare an emergency survival kit containing: Flashlight, radio, spare batteries, first aid kit, candles and matches/lighter, clothing and footwear, blankets, sleeping bags, receptacle, plastic bags and toilet tissue.

Public Works Department

The Municipality of Arran-Elderslie maintains approximately 362 km of roads and streets in Arran-Elderslie, and own and maintain over 65 bridges throughout the Municipality. The Public Works Department plans and directs the construction and maintenance of Municipal roads, bridges, parking lots, culverts, streetlights, sidewalks, civic address numbers, Municipal drains and other infrastructure as well as manages garbage and recyclable collection and landfill sites.

Garbage Collection

Garbage is collected weekly in Arran-Elderslie. Garbage day in Tara and Allenford is Wednesday, Chesley, Paisley and Elderslie is Thursday and Arran pick up is Friday. Place garbage bags at the curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the day of pickup. A maximum of two garbage bags per week are permitted from residential properties. If you would like more than two bags picked up for removal, you must purchase bag tags. These are available for purchase at the Municipal Office for \$3.50. A complete list of bag tag outlets is provided on the Arran-Elderslie website.

Corrugated Cardboard

Corrugated cardboard will not be picked up with your recycling. Cardboard recycling bins are located in Chesley behind the Elderslie Shop (beside the Municipal Office), the Chesley Hospital and the Chesley Grocery Store parking lot. In Paisley they are located by Paisley Sewage Plant (322 George St. N). In Tara they are located at the Arran Landfill, and at the Arran Shop.

Arran Landfill 671 Sideroad 20

Open Thursdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Saturdays 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.- Payment by Debit ONLY! Residential waste, demo materials, wood, brush, cardboard, electronic waste and compost are permitted at this location. There is a fee for residential waste, demo materials, wood and brush at this location. Compost material is free to drop off if it is brought into the landfill bagged in a brown compostable paper bag or in bulk. All compost containers are to be emptied and removed from the compost site. All items must be weighed. Bale wrap and white packaging styrofoam are also accepted for recycling at this location. Blue Board that is used for building purposes and Hazardous Waste is not accepted.

Chesley Landfill 230 4th Street SW

Open the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and every Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the months of October and November. No residential garbage is permitted. Only unpainted wood, tires, brush and metal will be accepted at this location. There is no charge for wood and brush at this location.

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

Household Hazardous Waste must be collected through Bruce County hosted events. Household hazardous waste materials include but are not limited to the following items: Paints & Stains, Propane Tanks, Used Oil, Aerosols, Batteries, Antifreeze, Oil Filters, Solvents, Household Cleaners, Fluorescent Lights, Fertilizers, Fuel, Pharmaceuticals, Fire Extinguishers, Pesticides, Pool Chemicals. The County of Bruce hosts Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events through the year. Visit their website for more information.

Fall Leaf Collection

The Chesley Landfill will be open EVERY Saturday in October & November for free leaf/compost drop-off. The Arran Landfill is open weekly Thursdays 8am-3pm and Saturday 8am-12 noon for free leaf/compost drop-off. 2024 curbside leaf collection will occur on October 29th & November 12th. Please call the Municipal Office 519-363-3039 ext. 102 to be placed on the list. Leaves must be in biodegradable paper bags. Materials in plastic bags will not be collected. Bags must be at the curb by 8am.

Recycling is collected every other week in Arran-Elderslie. Recycling pickup takes place in Arran, Allenford and Tara on Fridays. All others are the same day that your garbage is collected. Please place your blue box out for pick-up by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled pick up day. Recycling blue boxes are available for purchase at the Municipal Office at a cost of \$20.00. 


Arran-Elderslie, Municipality of 2024 Blue Box Collection Schedule

Building & Bylaw Department

The Chief Building Official is responsible for the duties set out in the Ontario Building Code and the Building Code Act, including the enforcement of Municipal Law.

Building:

- Administration, interpretation and compliance of the Ontario Building Code
- Process the applications for Building, Septic & Demolition permits
- Building Inspections as required by the Ontario Building Code

Zoning/Planning:

- Zoning inquiries and enforcement
- Administration of the Arran-Elderslie Comprehensive Zoning By-Law
- Land Use Planning inquiries

Property Standards:

- Manage the enforcement and interpretation of Municipal Law
- Investigates written Property Standards complaints
- Consult with property owners to comply with local Property Standards By-law.

Facilities, Parks & Recreation

Arran-Elderslie owns and maintains many facilities and sports fields that you can enjoy. The Municipality operates three community centres, ball diamonds, pools, parks, splash pads, soccer fields and many multi-purpose spaces. Facilities are available for a variety of services, programs and recreational opportunities. The Municipality also offers a wide variety of programs for residents of all ages and abilities. Splash Pads

Three Community Splash Pads are now operational, thanks to the dedicated community volunteers and generous donations and provincial grants. Splash pads typically open in early June and close mid September.






