Day Camp 2021

Day Camp takes place each summer in Chesley and Tara. This year the program will offer the hours of 8am to 5pm and will be available for full week enrollment only. You can sign up for 1 week, a few weeks or every week!

Children are looked after by qualified and caring staff. Program activities include crafts, playground visits, visiting local attractions, sports, games, and theme weeks.

Due to the Covid-19 restrictions, there will be no more than 15 children in a group with 2 instructors. Groups will utilize one specific area of the facility as a home base. That may include the arena floor, curling club floor, community hall, a lobby or a boardroom. Children of the same family will be in the same cohort.

All children will be screened and thermal scanned each day upon arrival. Should your child present with any Covid-19 symptoms, they will not be permitted to attend. All registrations must be in no later than June 25, 2021.

- class sizes will be much smaller
- lessons will be taught with the instructor being on the deck
- social distancing will be practiced
- changerooms may not be available

Waste must be received in containers that can be disposed of, containers are not emptied and returned (ie. gas cans). Empty metal paint cans are blue box recyclable.

Agricultural Waste Recycling

Starting June, 1st 2021 the Arran Landfill will be collecting clean twine, bale wrap, silage bags and bunker covers for recycling! This program is free of charge.

We are keen to explore ways to divert these plastics to help contribute to a more circular economy and conserve landfill space. Cleanfarms is working in Bruce County to test recycling options for these ag plastics.

These items must be placed in a clear collection bag. Farmers can pick up a collection bag from the landfill. Net wrap or netting, fiber twine (sisal) or nylon rope will not be collected as part of this program.

Fire Permits

We now utilize an online system for issuing and managing burn permits. The system uses your google map address. Many of the county roads use the word "Road" in the address. Example "12567 Bruce County Road 7". If you cannot find the configuration that works for your address, you can drag the red dot to your property! Or please call the municipality and we would be happy to assist.

Agricultural burn permits are valid for 4 weeks at a time. You are required to call the number on your permit prior to burning.

Once you get your account set up, this will be a much easier system to operate and you can obtain your fire permit from your home on a yearly basis. It is also very beneficial to our fire departments, and anything we can do to make their jobs easier is a win! Please note if you are having a fire of any size you are required to obtain a fire permit.



COVID-19 Update

The Province of Ontario has laid out a roadmap to reopening which includes three stages based on the percentage of the population that is vaccinated. There are a variety of ways for you to receive a vaccination.

Grey Bruce Health Unit Contact



As of June 14, 2021, 60.5% of Grey Bruce has been vaccinated with one dose!



If you are looking for information regarding COVID-19 vaccination, please call your health care provider. We want you to have the right information so you can make an informed decision. If you are interested in vaccination but are unsure of how to book, let us remove the barriers for you. There are now vaccinations available at the Chesley Medical Clinic through the Brockton and Area Family Health Team; call 519-363-3220 to book. Chesley Rexall is also providing vaccinations; call 519-363-3304 to book. In addition, Public health is offering mobile vaccination clinics for community groups unable to travel. If you feel there is interest in your community, please call the Chesley Medical Clinic and ask for Chenelle, and I would be happy to contact Public Health on your behalf. This is about protecting you, your family, your neighbors, and your healthcare system. It is about making sure your businesses thrive and schools stay open. Dr. Adam Winterton has given his thoughts on COVID-19 vaccination and he adds:

"We have eliminated any barriers to receiving a COVID vaccination and we highly recommend that you accept it. The vaccine is a safe and effective way to protect yourself, your family and the community as a whole.
